Open Trash Bins and Bears - AN IMPORTANT REMINDER

NEVER leave a bag outside a dumpster.

NEVER leave a lid unlatched.

A FED bear is a DEAD bear.

Bears will stay where food is accessible to them.



Bears in the area put people and the bear at risk.

Let us work together to discourage the bears from getting into garbage cans and trash dumpsters around the Kirkwood Valley.

Ensure your trash can is indoors or bear proof. Ensure the trash dumpsters lids are attached to the closest link to the lid.

REMINDER: What is accepted in the Green Waste Container

A 40-yard green waste container is available this year. This year it is located on the north side of the District's maintenance shop, located on Loop Road.

Please follow the instructions posted on the bin.





This container is intended to assist Kirkwood residents in disposal of green waste defensible space-type debris only. Examples are pine needles, small tree limbs, shrubs, bushes, and willows.

This container is also **NOT** intended for tree trunks, stumps, non-vegetation items, dirt, rock, lumber, trash.

Firewise provides Kirkwood Valley Chipping

All Firewise information on their chipping in the Kirkwood Valley during August 12-16, 2024, is located at their <u>website</u>.

The Amador Resource Conservation District (ARCD) will be providing chipping service to the Kirkwood Valley in August 12-16. The chipping contractors from the Amador Resource Conservation District (in partnership and funding from Alpine County) will provide FREE residential roadside chipping to residents in the Kirkwood Valley.

In the past few years, Amador and Alpine Counties have helped fund the green waste bins at the KMPUD transfer station. If you have trimmings and duff not acceptable for chipping, please take it to the green waste bin, they will be open and available all summer.
